Reaction by the Members of the Coalition for RECOM in Montenegro

Members of the Coalition for RECOM (Regional Commission for establishing the facts about war crimes and other violations of human rights at the territory of former Yugoslavia in the period 1991-2001) in Montenegro express deep regret concerning the event that marked the first Regional consultations with the representatives of religious communities about initiative for RECOM, held on 4 November in Sarajevo, when the meeting moderator, at the request of the Serbian Orthodox Church (SOC) and the Catholic Church, asked the Metropolitan of the Montenegrin Orthodox Church (MOC) Mihailo to leave the conference, which he did.

Members of the Coalition for RECOM in Montenegro emphasize that these consultations were organized by the Coalition for RECOM with religious communities. MOC is registered as religious community in Montenegro, and its believers and representatives must be acknowledged in their choice, like other citizens who freely enjoy the right to religion. Civic character of the Coalition for RECOM is not in line with inclusion into discussion on issues rooted in church canons, nor the compliance with the blackmails of any participant of the organised event for the purpose of excluding others who are invited at the same event and who made an effort to take part into its work.

Members of the Coalition for RECOM in Montenegro have asked an urgent meeting of the Coordination Council and an open debate on the issue, with the request for official apology to the Montenegrin Orthodox Church and Metropolitan Mihailo personally, as well as holding of the meeting with him to resolve as soon as possible and in successful manner the current and unwanted state of affairs in the spirit of tolerance and reconciliation, which are the basic principles of Coalition for RECOM and key reasons for membership in it.

Coalition for RECOM is the largest regional coalition currently having 1000 members. It is clear that decision-making within such a grand coalition will not always result in full agreement of all members, and the mistakes and errors could happen within it. Still, our mutual aim has to be above all, and that includes also recognition of the mistakes and their correction, in order to intensify further work on establishing facts and creating reconciliation climate in the region.
