PRESIDENT OF THE PARLIAMENT SHOULD RESPECT CITIZENS AND THE CIVIL SOCIETY

Non-governmental organizations that have nominated members of the RTCG Council invite the President of the Parliament Ranko Krivokapic to explain clearly and say accurately which NGOs are "hidden political parties" and which NGOs he considers as "real representatives of civil and non-governmental sector."

The process of appointing members of the RTCG Council ended 4 months ago. Why was the President of the Parliament Ranko Krivokapic silent for four months since when are known names of members of the Council and why he did not publicly present data on alleged party activism of 6 appointed members of the Council of RTCG?

We remind public that in the civil sector there was not a single comment concerning any of nominated member, and that is actually at the civil sector to decide on their own representatives in the Council of RTCG.

Therefore, President Ranko Krivokapic should explain which were the methods he came to that information and on who does he think exactly. Since we responsibly claim that appointed members of the Council are not "hidden political representatives", but acknowledged and recognized activists and members of civil society that only Mr Krivokapic does not see like that, the statement of Mr Krivokapic we consider as an attempt to manipulate in order to justify his involvement in violations of law in the Parliament headed by him.

We expect that Mr Krivokapic will publicly apologize to all the appointed members of the RTCG Council and that his actions will continue to be in line with the position which citizens of Montenegro confided to him. We expect also that Mr Krivokapic instead ignorant and abusive attitude towards civil society finally obtain to dialogue and respect the personality and integrity not only of the appointed members of the RTCG Council and civil society, but also the entire Montenegrin public.
