
How would you describe the character of this Government?




In your opinion, what is the main advantage and what is the shortcoming of this Government?














Who determines the policy and activities of the Government of Montenegro the most?




Have you heard of the “Marshall Plan – Europe Now” programme of the Government of Montenegro?




