


How much do you trust each of these institutions?




In your opinion, to what extent are politicians in Montenegro generally ready to take responsibility for their actions?








In which sphere do you consider the irresponsibility of politicians as particular danger?







Is the monthly income of your household members sufficient to cover living expenses for one month?




